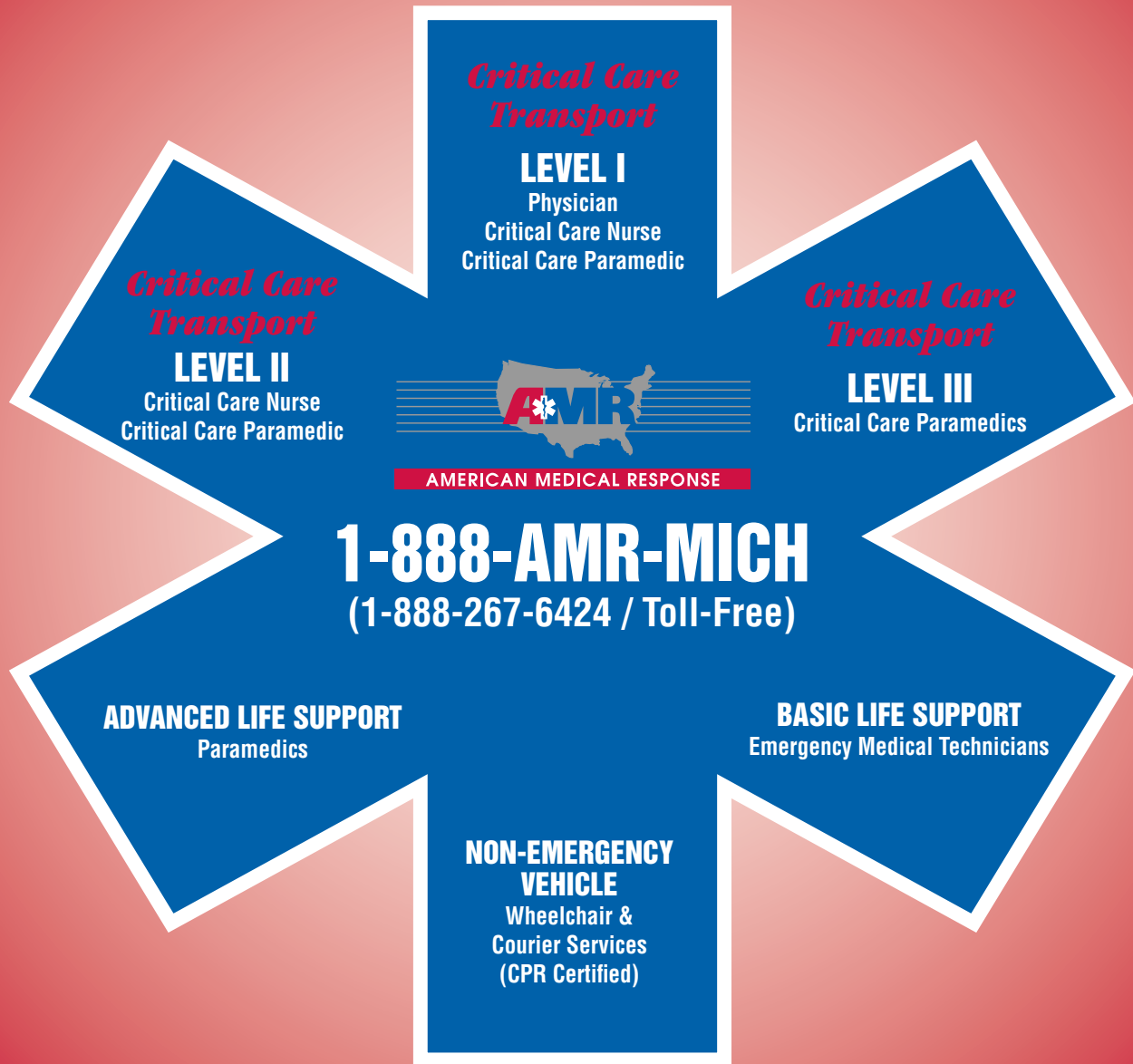

CRITICAL CARE TRANSPORT

(Emergency and Non-emergency)

Levels I, II, III – Decision for unit level to be based on information received from transporting facility.

For critically ill or injured patients who need to be transferred from one facility to another. These patients have specialized needs best addressed by physicians, nurses and paramedics trained in critical care.

EQUIPMENT

- Cardiac Monitor
- Invasive Monitoring
- Defibrillator with External Pacer & 12-Lead Capabilities
- Ventilator
- Chest Tubes
- Cellular Phone
- Glucometer

PROCEDURES

- Vasopressors
- Thrombolytics
- Advanced Airway Management
- ACLS Drugs & Procedures

ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT

(Emergency and Non-emergency)

For non-ambulatory patients who may require application of advanced life support techniques/equipment (IV therapy, endotracheal intubation and cardiac monitoring/portable ventilator, pumps and pulse oximeter).

BASIC LIFE SUPPORT

(Emergency and Non-emergency)

For non-ambulatory patients who are not critically ill or injured.

NON-EMERGENCY VEHICLE

- Wheelchair – For those patients who are confined to a wheelchair and require basic transportation. Drivers are CPR certified.
- Courier Services – Chauffeur licensed and CPR certified.
